Application Review Time

PSMRA's governing documents allow 45 days maximum for approval, approval with stipulations or disapproval of ACC requests. To expedite process, please include detailed plans.

2. Adjacent Property Owners Letter

All adjacent property owners, either contiguous or across the street, are to be given notice and the opportunity to write a letter of support or of concern to any project that visually or environmentally affects their property or their property rights.

- 3. Project Plans should include:
 - a. Detailed plan of existing property, house or landscaping drawn to scale.
 - b. Show property lines, curbs, sidewalks, walkways, streets or arroyos, and existing plants.
 - c. Show proposed changes including new plants, location, size of container in gallons for each plant; new walkways, paving, patio covers, shades and other features to be constructed.
 - d. Include materials such as brick, tile, stucco, Mexican tile, etc. Include proposed and existing colors.
- 4. Irrigation systems
 - a. Must be underground and have accessible control system to handle emergency situations.
 - b. Separate shut-off valves accommodate continued landscape watering during extended absence. Courthome owners are required to shut off interior water if gone more than 3 days.
- 5. Granite and artificial turf -- see guidelines attached
- 6. Minimum Landscaping Requirements per HBA's Sect 3.7

PSMRA: ACC Artificial Turf Guidelines

Any request for installation of artificial turf must include a minimum of one-foot square sample of the exact finished turf product along with the manufacturer's product specification. Material is to have full drainage system. Proposed specification/drawing for drainage system must be submitted to ACC for review.

Artificial turf may not exceed 70% landscape and cannot be of carpet material. Artificial turf must be installed in such a way as to appear seamless and uniform. All seams must be glued. Artificial turf must be professionally installed with a manufacturer's warranty of at least 7 years.

If converting to artificial turf in the front yard, all visible areas of grass must be changed to the same material, pile, weight, length, and color. Only natural grass colors are acceptable, to remain unchanged from the natural green lawn appearance.

Only turf requiring infill installation will be allowed. Infill material installation must be according to turf manufacturer's specifications or based upon standard industry guidelines.

To Provide for Review:

- o A minimum of one-foot square sample of the exact finished turf.
- A product manufacturer's product specification sheet.
- o Proposed specification/drawing for drainage system must be submitted.

Requirements:

- o Front yard turf may not exceed 70% of landscaping.
- \circ The **height** of the turf shall be a minimum of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches not to exceed $2^{\frac{1}{4}}$.
- o Face weight (pile weight) is 70 ounces or higher per square yard.
- Maximum width of stitch gauge is ³/₄ inch.
- Minimum of three 3" of compacted aggregate material shall be installed under theartificial turf surface (sub-based materials).
- Artificial turf must have some type of hardscape retention barrier such as sidewalk, curbing, driveway, bricks, or pavers bordering the artificial turf.
- A minimum 4" separation of granite, sidewalk, curbing, driveway, bricks, or pavers, must be installed at shared property lines.
- o A manufacturer's warranty of at least 7 years.

Once installed, the turf area is to be maintained like any other landscaped area and is to remain free of weeds and debris. Any fading or deterioration of wear patterns and incidental damage of the product will necessitate replacement. Replacement of the artificial turf must be pre-approved by the ACC to ensure like type, color, and quality of the replacement product.

Product improvements may occur at any time. The ACC will remain open to review new products and solutions as they become available and may modify, from time to time, the Artificial Turf guidelines.

Artificial Turf Application

(If installing Artificial Turf; include this completed form)

Any request for installation of artificial turf must include a minimum of one (1) foot square sample of the exact finished turf product along with the manufacturer's product specification. Material is to have full drainage system. Proposed specification/drawing for drainage system must be submitted to ACC for review.

Artificial turf may not exceed 70% landscape and cannot be of carpet material. Artificial turf must be installed in such a way as to appear seamless and uniform. All seams must be glued. Artificial turf must be professionally installed with a manufacturer's warranty of at least 7 years.

If converting to artificial turf in the front yard, all visible areas of grass must be changed to the same material, pile, weight, length, and color. Only natural grass colors are acceptable, to remain unchanged from the natural green lawn appearance.

<u>Only turf requiring infill installation will be allowed.</u> Infill material installation must be according to turf manufacturer's specifications or based upon standard industry guidelines.

To Provide for Review:

- A minimum of one-foot square sample of the exact finished turf.
- o A product manufacturer's **product specification sheet.**
- o Pavers or bricks sample.
- List of plants, shrubs, and trees.
- Proposed landscape design/drawing with drainage.

Requirements:

- Front yard turf may not exceed 70% of landscaping.
- o The **height** of the turf shall be a minimum of 1 ½ inches not to exceed 2 ¼".
- Face weight (pile weight) is 70 ounces or higher per square yard. Maximum width of stitch gauge is ¾ inch.
- Minimum of three 3" of compacted aggregate material shall be installed under the artificial turf surface(sub-based materials).
- Artificial turf must have some type of hardscape retention barrier such as sidewalk, curbing, driveway, bricks, or pavers bordering the artificial turf.
- A minimum 4" separation of granite, sidewalk, curbing, driveway, bricks, or pavers, must be installed atshared property lines.
- A manufacturer's warranty of at least 7 years.

Once installed, the turf area is to be maintained like any other landscaped area and is to remain free of weeds and debris. Any fading or deterioration of wear patterns and incidental damage of the product will necessitate replacement.

Replacement of the artificial turf must be pre-approved by the ACC to ensure like type, color, and quality of thereplacement product*.

*Product improvements may occur at any time. The ACC will remain open to review new products and solutions as they become available and may modify, from time to time, the Artificial Turf guideline

GRANITE GUIDELINES

(Adopted 2013)

If decomposed granite or other landscape rock is used, it must be of an "earth tone" color (brown, pink or gold) and not white, green blue, red, black, or other bright color. Granite size will be no less than 1/2 inch, nor more than 3/4 inch.

Lava rock and /or cinder rock is prohibited. All rock areas shall be treated with pre-emergent weed control at regular intervals to retard weed growth. Any request for installation of granite or rock overlay must include a representative sample and supplier information. River rock shall be three (3) inches to six (6) inches in diameter. All rock, cactus, and unaided nature may not be more than 10 per cent of landscaping. (Sect 3.7, HBA's)



PSMRA Satellite Dish Installation Guidelines

Garden and Single-Family Homes

Requirements:

- · Satellite dish installation is not permitted where visible from the street
- · All dishes must be 39" or less in diameter
- All satellite dish wiring must match background color with no visible excess wiring

Installation options when NOT visible from the street:

- Pole mount in back or side yard preferred option for most homeowners (see photos below)
 When scheduling installation, advance notice of a preferred pole mount may be necessary.
- · Exterior fascia using "under-eave" mounts
- Balcony
- · Block wall but not a party (shared) wall
- · Roof Note: Roof installations may void roof warranty.

Please be considerate of your neighbors in determining dish placement.

Any/all inactive satellite dishes MUST be removed by the Owner/Resident when owner/resident vacates the property or installs a new dish.

PSMRA Satellite Dish Installation Guidelines

Courthomes

Satellite dishes **are not** permitted to be installed on roofs, or attached to party walls, unit walls or balcony railings. Installation on roofs, party walls, unit walls, or balcony railings by any means is prohibited (including on tripods, various mountings, or cement bases) due to the potential for structural or surface damage. The Association maintainsthese components. Any exterior damage caused by the installation of a dish is the owner's responsibility. Associationcosts to repair damage will be charged to the owner. Please note any dish installation that damages the roof, or causes water to pool, voids roof warranty.

- Satellite dish installations must be completed by a professional, licensed satellite service technician.
- All dishes must be 39" in diameter-or less-and all mounts/dishes must be securely attached.
- All satellite dish wiring must match the exterior building color with no visible excess wiring
- Homeowners are responsible for any damages to the exterior of the building, including the roof, caused by the installation of the owners or their tenant's satellite dish.

Allowed Areas (see examples below):

Satellite dishes may be installed on:

- A pole in the owner/resident's yard (preferred if the signal (LOS) is strong enough) --OR
- The exterior fascia using "under-eave" mounts—OR
- A block wall, but not a party (shared) wall.

Installation:

Installer must install the dish in one of the suggested areas/ways. Installers should have all the materials needed for approved installations, with the exception a pole mount. When scheduling installation, advancenotice of a preferred pole mount may be necessary.

Court Home Exterior Repairs:

If scheduled Association repairs require the removal of a satellite dish, the removal and reinstallation are the homeowner's responsibility. For example, scheduled repair or replacement of fascia by the Association will require owners to remove dishes attached to the fascia board.

Please note: Any/all inactive satellite dishes MUST be removed by the Owner/Resident when owner/resident vacates the property or installs a new dish.
